Write your spelling list down the left hand side of the grid.


Write the definition of each of your spellings down the right hand side of the grid.



Adding My Words

Each letter has a value.

*Consonants are worth 10.

*Vowels are worth 5.

Write <u>your</u> spelling words. Then add up the value of each spelling word.

<u>Example</u>-<u>said</u>- 10 + 5 + 5 + 10 = 30

Spelling Shapes


Count your spelling words. Draw one shape for each word. Then write your spelling words inside each of the shapes.
