Sticky Knowledge

There are 8 points on a compass N, NE, E, SE, S, SW, W and NW.

The United Kingdom includes Northern Ireland, Scotland, England and Wales.

Great Britain is the land mass which contains Scotland, England and Wales.

The British Isles are a group of islands made up of: Ireland, Great Britain and over 6000 smaller islands.

Physical geography is naturally occurring (e.g. mountains) and human geography is man-made buildings and areas (e.g. canals).

Bagshot is in the county of Surrey.

Surrey, Hampshire, Berkshire, Greater London, Essex, Kent, Derbyshire and Cumbria are all counties in England

London, Liverpool, Manchester, Birmingham, Sheffield and Leeds are all cities in England.
