Your task is to create an information poster or leaflet about two different environmental issues that we face. One needs to be one we face in the UK and the second needs to be a global issue.

It is up to you how you present this information, but you need to include a description, facts, any protocols or strategies in place to fix or prevent the issue getting worse and pictures.





For example:-

If you chose to do one half of your project on Forrest/wildfires you would need to include how they start, what are the causes? Are they started by humans or is it a natural occurrence?

Please use this week's daily project time of 45 minutes each day to complete this work.



What you need to do...

- Research environmental issues that we face which are relevant right now
- Pick two different issues that interest you (One we must deal with in the UK and one that is a global issue)
 - Using your research information, you need to create your project to include lots of detail and descriptions. (Try to include fronted adverbials, expanded noun phrases, subordinate and relative clauses.)

You could present this in any creative way you would like such as a poster, leaflet, a model, the more creative you can be the better!

- Finally add some pictures or drawings to your work to emphasise your information.
