Reading

- ▶ Before completing each activity, read either a few pages or a chapter of your own reading book and work through this PowerPoint - an activity each day.

Activity 1 - changing the sentences

Find one sentence in your book and alter it 3 times. Example below.	Find two sentences in your book and alter them 3 times. Example below.	Find three sentences in your book and alter them 3 times. Example below.	Find four sentences in your book and alter them 3 times. Example below.

Open up your chosen book and sneak through the pages till you find a sentence that you like. For instance, in a story of mine called 'Lazy Jack', I have found this sentence.

The next day, Jack went to work for a baker.

You will only need half of the sentence so either take the first half - or the second half.

I have decided to use the first half, 'The next day Jack went...'. Now invent a list of new sentences, using the piece you have stolen. Eg.

The next day, Jack went to visit a Cyclops who had invited him for tea.

The next day, Jack went to the market and juggled with a bag of oranges.

The next day, Jack went to visit his aunt but she had no time for him because he fell asleep by the fire.

See how inventive you can be?

If you were to change the ending of this book or another book that you have read, draw a picture of what your ending would be.

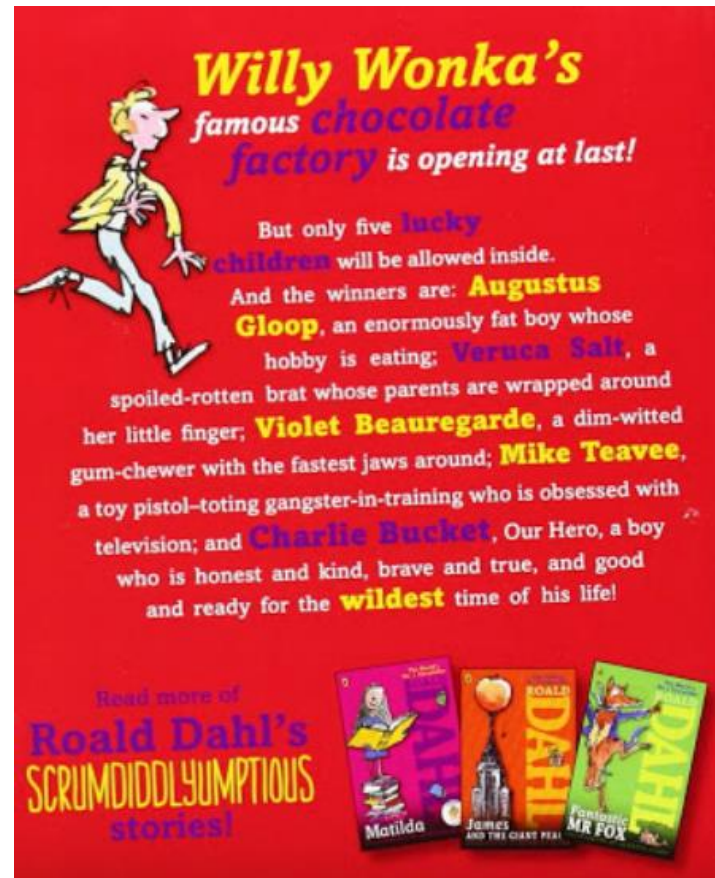
Activity 3 -

Activity 4 - writing a blurb

A **blurb** is the text on back cover of a book. It is a summary of the story. It aims to get the reader interested in buying or reading the book.
