Dear Y6 Parents/Carers,

The summer term – filled with key milestones in the journey of a Connaught child – is now upon us. Please read on to find out more about this half term and what it has in store.

The SATs are fast approaching and will be happening in w/c 13th May. The assessments are scheduled as follows:

Monday 13 th May:	English grammar, punctuation and spellings Paper 1: Questions (45 mins)
	English grammar, punctuation and spellings Paper 2: Spellings (20 mins)
Tuesday 14 th May:	English reading (60 mins)
Wednesday 15 th May:	Maths Paper 1: arithmetic (30 mins)
	Maths Paper 2: reasoning (40 mins)
Thursday 16 th May:	Maths Paper 3: reasoning (40 mins)

The children have been working incredibly hard since joining Year 6 and we are delighted with the progress they have all made since September. We have every confidence that they will make themselves proud.

In the build-up to the assessments, we will be doing some extra practice and going over previously taught units of work. Our aim is for your child to feel confident and relaxed going into these tests so we will be balancing these practice lessons with other opportunities for non-SATs learning and a chance to wind-down. We will also be including lots of positive praise, encouragement and mindfulness to support their wellbeing. Please do speak to your child's class teacher if you feel your child is getting overly worried or anxious.

Thank you for your support with extra SATs revision homework. Every little bit of extra practice will help and will go a long way in making your child feel confident in their skills. We hope that your children are seeing the value of the extra revision and we hope that they continue with this as we get closer to SATs. Please speak to your class teacher if you are unsure where your child should be focusing and please be aware that we may be sending home extra homework in the coming weeks.

This will help them feel well-prepared and more confident for the learning journey ahead.
